Nebraska Commission on African American Affairs Appoints Mogien “Mo” Boyd as Executive Director

Lincoln, NE — The Nebraska Commission on African American Affairs (NCAAA) has appointed Mogien “Mo” Boyd as its new Executive Director, marking a significant step forward in strengthening the Commission’s leadership, operations, and long-term impact across the state.

Boyd brings experience in private-sector and nonprofit leadership, organizational strategy, and public service. A Nebraska native, he resides in Lincoln and holds a Bachelor of Arts in History from the University of Nebraska–Lincoln and a Masters in Organizational Leadership from Bellevue University.

As Executive Director, Boyd is responsible for advancing the Commission’s statutory mission, strengthening governance and operational infrastructure, and aligning programs, partnerships, and resources to support sustainable, positive outcomes for African American communities throughout Nebraska.

“I am honored to serve as Executive Director of the Nebraska Commission on African American Affairs,” said Boyd. “The Commission plays a vital role in informing policy and promoting equitable access to opportunity. My focus is on strengthening internal systems, clarifying priorities through a strategic framework, and ensuring responsible stewardship of public resources to deliver meaningful impact.”

Boyd’s leadership experience includes strategic planning, organizational assessment, and change management, with an emphasis on aligning mission, structure, and execution. Since assuming the role, Boyd has prioritized stakeholder engagement and conducting thorough organizational assessments, while steering the final phases of NCAAA’s comprehensive strategic plan to establish a clear roadmap for the Commission’s future work.
